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Two days -the day of Hurricane/Flood Checklist:

| Bring inside any items that could be blown or washed away |
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| Secure any outdoor signage. |
| Close and lock all windows and doors. |
| Board up windows and doors |
| Clean out refrigerator of food that could spoil during power outage |
| Turn refrigerator and freezers to coldest setting. Avoid opening doors |
| Turn off propane tanks and unplug small appliances |
| Battery operated flashlight is operational |
| Battery operated radio |
| Sandbag any area that is subject to flooding |
| Relocate any valuable or fragile items |
| Secure electronics (computers, cash registers, etc) with straps and cover with plastic |
| Backup documents (seal in waterproof containers) |
| Bank deposits of cash or properly secured in safe |
| Designate important contacts to save the are critical to business operations |
| Designate chain of command and verify all have proper access to facility (locks, alarms, etc) |
| Advise maintenance provider of possible floods/shut down |
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
